Becoming educated about human trafficking is the first step in combating this crime. Learn how to respond and engage in prevention through an in-person or virtual training. You can bring awareness to your community no matter where you are located by hosting an online training for your coworkers, classmates, church group, or other circle of influence. The cost to host a training is a flat rate (not per person) and we encourage you to invite all who will listen to this important information.

□ Sex Trafficking in America: Let's Start the Conversation



Length: 2 hours | Cost: \$100

What does sex trafficking look like in America? Who are the most vulnerable?

Thousands of men, women, and children are sexually exploited nationwide, and it will take each of us doing

our part to solicit change. Dispel the myths about human trafficking and deepen your knowledge of buyers, traffickers, and victims. Understand recruitment tactics, the grooming process, and at-risk populations. Learn how you can spread awareness and join the fight against modern day slavery.

□ Vulnerable Youth: Identifying Predators and Protecting Children



Length: 2 hours | Cost: \$100

What if all children had an adult to protect and love them?

It's estimated that there are more than 42 million child abuse survivors in the US. Learn how to protect the

children and youth in your home and community. This presentation includes information on the roots of vulnerability, the mind and tactics of predators, the role of pornography and technology, and how to protect children and adolescents from becoming victims of exploitation.

The Shepherd Project calls on individuals and the Church to address trafficking at its roots and move from awareness to action. This program provides monthly virtual trainings conducted by expert speakers on various topics of abuse. The year is divided into four quarters addressing sex trafficking, child abuse, pornography, and sexual assault. Participants are equipped with knowledge and resources to bring back to their church and community to respond to abuse and engage in prevention. Participants register quarterly.

□ The T.A.M.A.R. Method - Ministering to Victims of Sexual Trauma

How do you respond when someone discloses that they've been sexually abused?

Every 73 seconds, an American is sexually assaulted (RAINN, 2019). The Samaritan Women is leveraging its expertise in trauma and abuse to equip the faithful to respond to the sexually wounded with compassion and wisdom. Topics include: abuse and exploitation in scripture, types and prevalence of abuse, effects of sexual trauma, gender and cultural considerations, shame, how to respond to adult and child disclosures, and the Church as a sanctuary.
